Oleksandr Sukhodolia is a Fulbright Visiting Scholar at George Washington University, working on issues concerning energy security in the context of Ukraine's energy sector transformation and the strengthening of global competition for energy resources. He received a doctoral degree in electrical engineering from the National Technical University of Ukraine Kyiv Polytechnic Institute in 1998 and a doctoral degree in public administration from the National Academy of Public Administration in 2006. His doctoral research centered on energy policy issues in Ukraine. Sukhodolia gained practical experience in energy policy implementation while working for the Ukrainian State Committee on Energy Conservation, developing regulatory legislation on energy conservation. Later he worked at the National Security and Defense Council of the Ukrainian Secretariat, developing policy on energy and national security. He has been a lecturer at the National Technical University of Ukraine, lecturing on energy efficiency, and has published a number of books and articles.
